AN ORDER REORGANIZING THE CREATION OF THE CITY PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL (CPOC) OF THE CITY OF MALOLOS

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State to safeguard the integrity of its territory and the well-being of its citizenry and provide effective mechanisms or measures to ensure public safety and law and order;

WHEREAS, Section 4, Article II of the 1987 Constitution explicitly declares in part that the prime duty of the Government is to serve and protect the people;

WHEREAS, Section 5, Article II of the same affirms that the maintenance of peace and order, the protection of life, liberty, and property, and the promotion of the general welfare are essential for the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy;

WHEREAS, the threat, danger, and menace to peace and order posed by criminality, insurgency, and subversion places the LGU in an immeasurable risk and requires the collective and concerted efforts of all the government agencies concerned;

WHEREAS, Section 116 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, in relation to Executive Order No. 309, series of 1987 of the Office of the President, as amended by Executive Order

No. 773, series of 2009 mandates the creation and organization of the (Provincial/City/Municipal Peace and Order Council);

WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior and Local Government issued Memorandum Circular No. 2019-143 providing for the guidelines on the functions of the peace and order councils, peace and order council secretariats, special action committees, technical working group, and barangay peace and order committees;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 465 (2) (iii) of Republic Act No. 7160, the LCE shall issue Executive Orders for the faithful and appropriate enforcement and execution of laws and ordinances:

NOW THEREFORE, I, ATTY. CHRISTIAN D. NATIVIDAD, Mayor of the City of Malolos, Province of Bulacan, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, do hereby the creation of the City Peace and Order Council, to wit:

SECTION I. COMPOSITION. The component City Peace and Order Council is hereby reorganized to be composed of the incumbent officers or officials of the following:

SECTION II. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF THE CITY/MUNICIPAL PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL. The City/Municipal Peace and Order Council shall perform and carry out the following roles and responsibilities:

- A. Convene the CCPOC/MPOC quarterly, or as often as the need arises;
- B. Adopt the following resolutions:
 1. A resolution on the composition of the CCPOC/MPOC immediately after the assumption of the new Chairperson, and in the event that there is any change in the composition thereof;
 2. A resolution on the creation of Special Action Committees;
 3. An annual resolution on the schedule of the quarterly meetings;
 4. A resolution on the composition of the CCPOC/MPOC Secretariat;
 5. A resolution on the approval of CCPOC/MPOC POPS Plan; and
 6. Such other resolutions, as may be necessary.

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- C. Invite other concerned agencies which are not included in E.O. No. 773, s.2009, (e.g. intelligence communities or agencies) to join or participate in PPOC meetings and/or activities, as may be necessary;
- D. Formulate a 3-year Local Peace and Order and Public Safety Plan (POPS) Plan, to be incorporated/and inconsistent with the Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP);
- E. Create a Special Action Committee (SAC) on Anti-Insurgency and Anti-Criminality, Crisis Management, and other SACs, to prevent or address the issues or incidents on peace and order and public safety;
- F. Create a Technical Working Group (TWG) for the purpose of POPS Planning, following the guidelines prescribed by this Omnibus and other DILG issuances on the tools and processes on POPS Planning;
- G. Provide a forum for interdisciplinary dialogue and deliberation of major issues and concerns affecting peace and order and public safety within their respective areas of jurisdictions;
- H. Recommend strategic actions or activities aimed at promoting, improving, or enhancing peace and order and public safety measures, including anti-insurgency measures within their respective areas of jurisdictions;
- I. Recommend measures to converge and orchestrate internal security operations efforts of civil authorities and agencies, military, and police;
- J. Formulate and adopt an effective mechanism for the coordination, cooperation, and consultation involving the local executives, citizenry, and law enforcement agencies under R.A.

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6975, as amended, in the adoption of the Community and Service-Oriented Policing (CSOP) System;

- K. Apply moral suasion to and/or recommend sanctions against local chief executives who are giving material and political support to the insurgents;
- L. Monitor the provision of livelihood and infrastructure development programs and projects in the remote rural and indigenous population areas to isolate them from the insurgent's ideological, political, and organizational works;
- M. Serve as the convergence mechanism to support the Enhance Comprehensive Local Integration Program (E-CLIP) Committee in its implementation, at the Provincial level;
- N. Support the implementation of ELCAC initiatives;
- O. Participate in the conduct of annual POC performance audit;
- P. Provide regular support staff and financial assistance from the Office of the C/MPOC Chairperson to support the C/MPOC Secretariat;
- Q. Perform such other functions as may be directed by law or higher authorities.

SECTION III. MEETINGS. The C/MPOC shall meet every three (3) months, or as often as needed, to discuss relevant concerns on peace and order and public safety. After the quorum has been proven, the Chairperson shall preside over the meeting or in case of the latter's absence, the C/MPOC Vice Chairperson. In case that neither is present, the Chairperson shall designate any member of the Council to preside at the meeting.

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SECTION IV. SECRETARIAT. The head of the CPOC Secretariat shall handle the administrative, operational and technical activities of the CPOC. The Secretariat shall also be liaising and coordinating the activities with appropriate agencies of the government.

SECTION V. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, such parts or portions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION VI. REPEALING CLAUSE. All orders or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Executive Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION VII. DISSEMINATION. A copy of this Executive Order shall be furnished to the Office of the Provincial Governor, for its information and guidance pursuant to Section 455 (1) (xii) or R.A. 7160, as amended, and shall be posted in the City Government of Malolos' official website.

SECTION VIII. EFFECTIVITY. This Order shall take effect immediately.
