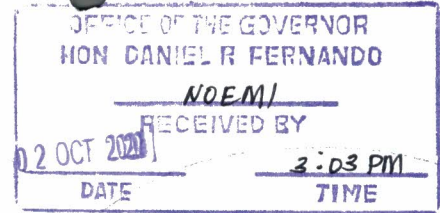

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 47

AN ORDER PROVIDING FOR THE GUIDELINES AND MEASURES THAT SHALL BE OBSERVED WITHIN THE CITY OF MALOLOS FROM 1 OCTOBER TO 31 OCTOBER 2020 IN CONNECTION WITH THE MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 75-A of the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) dated 28 September 2020, the quarantine classification of the Province of Bulacan is de-escalated to Modified General Community Quarantine;

WHEREAS, notwithstanding said de-escalation of quarantine classification, the same Resolution marked the Province of Bulacan to be among the places with increased risk of transmission;

WHEREAS, as of 1 October 2020, the City of Malolos has already registered 626 cases of coronavirus disease;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 455, (2) (iii) of the Local Government Code of 1991, the City Mayor as the Chief Executive of the city government has the power to issue such executive orders for the faithful and appropriate enforcement and execution of laws and ordinances;

NOW THEREFORE, I, ENGR. GILBERT T. GATCHALIAN, City Mayor of the City of Malolos, Bulacan, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, towards promotion of the General Welfare within the City, do hereby order strict observance of the following policies and measures for the entire period of Modified General Community Quarantine in the City of Malolos:

SECTION I. ADOPTION OF THE OMNIBUS GUIDELINES ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF COMMUNITY QUARANTINE IN THE PHILIPPINES FOR AREAS PLACED UNDER MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE (MGCQ) AND OTHER RELEVANT ISSUANCES:

1. Only Authorized Persons Outside of Residence (APOR) and persons between the ages of 21 and 59 years old who are neither pregnant nor having immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risk, are allowed to go outside of residence;

2. The movement of all persons allowed to go outside of residence shall be limited to accessing essential goods and services, for work in the offices and industries allowed to operate during MGCQ and only for the activities allowed within areas under MGCQ;
3. Minimum public health standards shall be observed at all times, such as but not limited to mandatory wearing of face masks, frequent hand washing, strict observance of social distancing, wearing of face shields, and regular disinfection of public areas;
4. Indoor and outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of exercises are allowed. However, persons 20 years old and below and those above 60 years of age are highly discouraged to go to public places in order to do indoor and outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of exercises;
5. Mass gatherings shall be allowed provided that the number of participants shall be limited to 50% of the seating or venue capacity. The Malolenyos are strictly discouraged to hold any non-essential mass gathering. Only work conferences and religious services are the encouraged form of mass gathering;
6. For purposes of learning and education, the relevant guidelines of the Department of Education, the Commission on Higher Education, and the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) shall apply;
7. Work in all public and private offices may be at full operational capacity. Persons who are 60 years old and above, those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risks, including pregnant women shall work under alternative work arrangements;
8. All public and private constructions are allowed subject to compliance with the Department of Public Work and Highways Department Order No. 39 Series of 2020 and Department Order No. 2020-005 of the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development;
9. All establishments are enjoined to strictly observe the categorization and negative list provided under the Department of Trade Industry Memorandum Circular No. 20-44 Series of 2020. Under the MGCQ, the following shall operate on a capacity lower than 100%:
 - a. Hotel and other accommodation establishments 50% - Only hotels and other accommodations with accreditation from the Department of the Interior and Local Government and the Department of Tourism (DOT), and only upon the issuance of a Certificate of Authority by the DOT are permitted to operate;
 - b. Dine – in services for Restaurants on a 75% seating capacity;
 - c. Barbershops and Salons on a 75% operational capacity;
 - d. Establishments offering personal care, full body massage and aesthetic procedures and services on a 50% operational capacity;
 - e. Gyms and Fitness studios on a 50% operational capacity;
 - f. Testing and tutorial centers on a 50% operational capacity;
 - g. Review centers on a 50% operational capacity;
 - h. Internet cafes, the operation of which shall be limited to work or educational purposes on a 50% capacity;
 - i. Drive-in cinemas on a 50% capacity;

- j. Pet-grooming services on a 50% capacity;
 - k. Language, driving, dance/acting/voice schools on a 50% capacity;
 - l. Entertainment industries (e.g. traditional cinemas and theaters) on a 50% capacity;
 - m. Libraries, archives, museums and cultural centers on a 50% capacity;
 - n. Tourist destinations (water parks, beaches, resorts) on a 50% capacity;
 - o. Travel agencies, tour operators, reservations service and related activities on a 50% capacity;
 - p. Tattoo and body piercing on a 50% capacity;
 - q. Live events (subject to DOT guidelines on Meetings, Incentives, Conventions, Exhibitions & Business Events);
10. The following are business activities not allowed to operate under MGCQ:
 1. Holding of traditional cockfighting & operations of cockpit;
 2. Beerhouses and similar establishments whose primary business is serving alcoholic drinks;
 3. Kid amusement industries.
 11. Accredited Diplomatic missions and international organizations may resume in full operations.
 12. Public Transportation operators shall comply with the relevant guidelines of the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB). All public transportation terminals shall strictly practice health and physical distancing protocols and shall implement no face shield and face mask, no ride policy.

SECTION II. LIFTING OF QUARANTINE PASS REQUIREMENTS AND OF THE TWO-DAY WINDOW PERIOD. For persons allowed to go outside of residence, quarantine passes shall no longer be necessary. Non-residents of the City of Malolos are allowed to enter the Malolos Public Market, supermarkets, groceries and malls within the City.

SECTION III. LOCALIZED QUARANTINE, CONTACT TRACING AND SWABBING. The City through the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office, the City Health Office, the City Police Force, and the Liga ng mga Barangay shall work in full coordination and cooperation in order to ensure timely implementation of localized containment as may be deemed necessary.

The City Health Office Contact Tracing Team and Swabbing Team are hereby mandated to maximize all available resources towards ensuring 100% contact tracing and timely swabbing.

SECTION IV. CURFEW. Except for APORS, curfew within the City of Malolos shall be from 11PM until 4AM.

SECTION V. FULL COMPLIANCE. The Chief of Police shall work with the Liga ng mga Barangay, the Traffic Management Group, and the Business Permit and Licensing Division under the City Administrator's Office to ensure full compliance with this Executive Order and with the existing Ordinances and relevant law, rules and regulations. Among others, only persons allowed to go outside of residence shall be seen roaming around the City; curfew and strict physical distancing under all circumstances shall be implemented.

SECTION VI. INTERZONAL AND INTRAZONAL MOVEMENT. Unless otherwise directed by the Department of the Interior and Local Government, the One Stop Shop for the granting of travel authorities required for interzonal and intrazonal movement shall continue to operate. Only travels allowed under the IATF-EID Guidelines shall be permitted. Interzonal movement of persons (i.e. from the City of Malolos to an area declared to be under GCQ,) for any purpose *other than leisure* shall be permitted.

SECTION VII. BALIKBAYANS, RETURNING MALOLENYOS OFWs. Returning residents shall comply with the relevant guidelines of the Overseas Workers Welfare Administration, the Department of the Interior and Local Government and the Department of Health. All returning residents are hereby required to report immediately to the Barangay Hall upon arrival to the City.

SECTION VIII. CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE OUTSIDE RESIDENCE. Consumption of alcoholic beverages outside one's own residence is strictly prohibited.


SECTION IX. CLOSURE OF MEMORIAL PARKS, CEMETERIES, COLUMBARIUMS AND THE LIKE TO VISITORS FROM 29 OCTOBER 2020 UNTIL 4 NOVEMBER 2020. Consistent with Executive Order No. 32 of the Provincial Governor, all memorial parks, cemeteries and columbariums shall be closed to visitors from 29 October 2020 until 4 November 2020 in order to ensure that as the Malolenyos remember the passing of their loved ones, physical and social distancing shall not be compromised.

SECTION X. COVID-19 POINT PERSON. The City Fire Marshall is hereby designated as the City of Malolos Point Person for COVID-19 in compliance with item 8 Section 1 of Executive Order No. 32 of the Provincial Governor.

SECTION XI. INCORPORATION CLAUSE. All laws, rules and regulations and issuances issued under the authority of the National Government and of the Provincial Government are hereby incorporated and shall form integral parts of this Order.

SECTION XII. EFFECTIVITY. This Order shall take effect immediately upon signing hereof.
